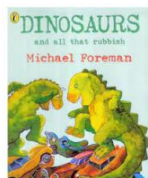

After the disruption that Covid has caused to education over the last few years, it is vital that we work together to help give all our pupils the best chance we can of a settled year where there can be targeted support to help catch up the learning that was missed. Therefore, please make sure your child attends school as much as possible. If your child is too ill to come to school, please phone the school office before school starts to let them know.

From next week, we will change how we come into school – the green gate will open at 8:35am as always but the blue gate will open at 8:40am (5 minutes early). This is so that there is time to reach classes so when the classroom doors open at 8:45am, children can go straight in and get settled for their learning. We would appreciate your help with this and ask that you walk round with your children and wait for the classroom door to be open ensuring that children are waiting patiently and safely.
